

## **Keynote Speaker: Rev. Jonathan Fisk**

First Session: (Friday evening): Evangelism in Acts. Focusing on what the Apostles actually said when they had a chance to say it.

Second Session: (Saturday morning) Look at the factual evidence for the resurrection and our ability as Christians to answer naysayers.

Third Session: (Saturday morning) Look at how Law and Gospel play into the Second session's topic, particularly making use of some of the most important theses of Luther's Heidelberg Disputation, and linking them up with the content of the resurrection apologetic.

## **Breakout Session Leaders and Topics:**

1. **Rev. Marvin Bublitz** – Are “*children to be seen and not heard*”? That was a phrase spoken to children in years past. But in truth, children have a lot to say about the love of God in Christ Jesus, especially in their vocation as a child. In this section we will explore how we can help equip children to be seen and heard as they live and speak the faith God has given them in Holy Baptism.
2. **Dr. William Mundt** – “What on earth are you doing, for heaven's sake! Witnessing in and through Vocation. When members of the crowd came to John the Baptizer asking, “What then should we do?” he did not advise them to “give up your day job” but rather, “be honest, faithful and content” (Luke 3). Being a Christian does not mean leaving the world, but living in it as opposed to “of” it (cf. FC XII)
3. **Rev. Ronald Mohr** – Joyfully in Mission: Engaging in the mission of our Saviour Jesus often produces more anxiety in us than eagerness. But in both the Old Testament and New Testament, being God's people in mission is spoken of in terms of JOY! This session will explore how “the joy of the Lord is our strength” for the mission to which Jesus has called us.
